# THE JURA

The Jura is a beautiful area in Eastern France, in the foothills of the Alps and a neighbourly distance from its famous cousin Burgundy. A rustic place famed for its gorgeous dairy products from unique cattle breeds - it is also one of France's most over-looked wine-producing areas.

With its unique grape varieties *Savagnin*, *Trousseau* and *Poulsard*, as well as its fine examples of *Pinot Noir* and *Chardonnay*, and its legendary winemakers and practices, the Jura is a particularly fascinating and distinctive region.

Jura whites are made in two styles - '*ouillé*' and '*sous voile*'. More on these below.

Jura reds tend to be delicate, bright & perfumed wines balanced by their gentle earthiness and rusticity.

## *Ouillé* White //

Ouillé refers to wine made conventionally (without any oxidation). These wines resemble those of nearby Burgundy, but are uniquely deep, textural & savoury thanks to the Jurassic *terroir* and microclimate.

## *Sous Voile* White //

Sous Voile is the Jura's signature-style, allowing a layer of yeast (the voile or 'veil') to form over wine in barrels so that it may naturally undergo a process of controlled oxidation. This technique often imparts intense flavours of walnut and hazelnut, stewed apple and dried hay. It is similar to the technique used in southern Spain to produce some sherries

## *Vin Jaune* White //

Vin Jaune is the Jura's speciality - 100% Savagnin grapes that are aged *sous voile* in barrel for a minimum of 6 years, and bottled in its unique 620ml '*clavelin*' bottle. The oxidation process turns the wine a glorious golden-yellow hue, hence the name. The resulting wines are deep, rich & powerful— the perfect drink with a good cheese board (Comté!).
